**Minutes of the Special Meeting held on Monday 20th September 2010 at 7.30pm in Elmley
Castle village hall**

Planning

To consider:

- a) **Amendments to PAW/10/01510 – Mr & Mrs C Sharp, Stewards House, Hill Lane –**
Comment, Support the application.
- b) **PAW/10/ 02077/LB Mr & Mrs B Druce, Park Cottage, Main Street – Replacement of
plastic windows in gable North & South elevation with traditional timber casement
window with single glazing –** Comment, Support the application.
- c) **PAW/10/02188/PN – Mr J Eaton, Park Mill – Development of bridged access from
Willow Cottage over brook to field. Retrospective - Location - Willow Cottage, 3,
Millers Walk, Elmley Castle** after much discussion a vote was taken 4 votes in favour, 4
votes against & 1 abstention. It was agreed that the comment to WDC would be, the Parish
Council was divided into no objection & those who do object.

Miscellaneous Correspondence

a) **County Council** had received a request from the resident of 2 Millfield Estate, Mill Lane for the Provision of a Disabled Persons Parking Place Order – after consideration it was agreed that the concerns of the Council would be communicated to the County Council i.e. Mill Lane is narrow, is in the AONB & the Conservation Area & parking is not an inherent problem. There is not a congestion problem & the Parish Council strongly objects to the application which is wholly unnecessary.

b) **Grit Bins/Rock Salt** – the clerk had quotes from County Builders for 3 salt bins @ £100 each & 2 bulk bags rock salt @ £110 each, both plus vat, (one bag would fill 5 bins) Mr Shaw proposed & Mr Whitcombe seconded a proposition that the quotes were acceptable & the order should be placed, all in favour. Mr Stephens offered to store the rock salt under cover & suggested that everything be delivered to him. Mr Whitcombe & other Councillors offered to distribute the bins & fill them, refilling when/if necessary. The clerk was most grateful for these offers of help.

c) The clerk had spoken at the end of the last meeting, to Mr Hickman about the Tree Fund. Mr Hickman had reiterated his wish that the Tree Fund would be a Restricted Fund & would not therefore not form part of the Annual Return, but would be dealt with in the same way as the Playground Account, Mr Mackison proposed & Mr Stephens seconded a proposal that the Tree Fund is a Restricted Fund, this was acceptable to the Parish Council.
